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## **Presentation Policy**

## Aims of the Presentation Policy

The purpose of this policy is to produce a consistent approach towards the presentation of work throughout the school and continue to encourage in all children, a sense of pride in how their work should look at all class levels.

#### <u>General</u>

The general aim of this policy is to apply a standardised approach to the presentation of written work, supporting the aims of the English curriculum plan 'to clarify thinking through oral language, writing and reading'. In this policy, specific guidelines at each stage are outlined and supported by a template in the attached appendices. These guidelines are not intended to interfere with Class Teachers autonomy in the classroom. Rather, they intend to support the Teacher in encouraging children to present work of the highest quality. In addition, templates are available for written and Maths work for all Class Teacher from  $1^{st}$  to  $6^{th}$  Class. (See Appendices A – F).

#### **Stationery Guidelines**

To aid the presentation of work certain items of stationery are required at each class level. These items will be outlined in the school book lists each year except for Junior and Senior Infants whose stationery requirements are supplied by the class teacher.

## 1<sup>st</sup>/ 2<sup>nd/</sup>3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Class

Each child to have the following with them in school each day:

- 3 HB Pencils
- 30cm Ruler
- 2 Red pens
- Eraser
- Pencil sharpener
- Set of 12 colouring pencils (not markers)
- Pritt sticks \* 2
- Display poly pocket book (80 pockets)

#### 5<sup>th</sup> /6<sup>th</sup>

Each child to have the following with them in school each day:

• All requirements up to 4<sup>th</sup> class and a Geometry Set

# <u>Guidelines for all written work (except Maths)</u>

#### Junior/Senior Infants

- Use of a sharp pencil to complete written work
- Accurate letter formation achieved through correct pencil grip and correct posture when sitting
- Children are expected to leave senior infants capable of writing on the line and with adequate even spacing between their words

## 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> : Appendix A

Children are expected to meet all the requirement for Junior/Senior Infants and

- Title (page number/heading/topic) and date their work in pencil
- Correctly insert a margin in their own work (independently)

• Use page margins correctly ensuring words are spaced accurately and evenly on lines

## <u>3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> : Appendix B</u>

Children are expected to meet all the requirements up to 2<sup>nd</sup> class and:

- Title (page number/heading/topic) and date their work in pencil
- Use page margins correctly, ensuring words are placed accurately on the pages. Margin to be completed in red pen
- Number questions in the margin in line with corresponding text references. Questions numbered in red pen
- Write accurately in cursive text in line with the handwriting policy and modelled by the Class teacher
- Write on both sides of the paper and fill each page before turning to the next
- The margin at the end of each page should be left blank
- The end of one piece of work will be clearly identified at the discretion of the Class Teacher e.g. a red line or space
- Mistakes erased neatly and the correct answer written on the same line

## $5^{\text{th}}/6^{\text{th}}$ : Appendix C

Children are expected to meet all the requirements up to  $4^{th}$  class and will write in pen during the  $2^{nd}$  term of  $5^{th}$  class.

# **Guidelines for Mathematics**

## Junior/Senior Infants

- Emphasis will be placed on ensuring children place one digit in each box.
- Where children write in a Maths copy spaces will be left between sums as modelled by the Class Teacher

<u>1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>: Appendix D</u> Children will be expected to:

- Title (page number/heading/topic) and date their work in pencil
- 1 digit in each box
- Start to write after moving down and in 2 boxes in their Maths copy to allow for the expansion of numbers and renaming calculations
- Label each sum correctly and ensure even spaces so that separate sums are easily identifiable

## <u>3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>/ 6<sup>th</sup> : Appendix E</u>

Children will be expected to meet all requirements up to 2<sup>nd</sup> class and:

- Complete work and titles in pencil (pen from 5<sup>th</sup>) with margins and numbers completed in red pen
- Show workings either as part of the sum or in a separate part of the page as selected from the templates given. The template chosen will be decided by each individual class teacher.

#### <u>Other</u>

- Doodles or scribbles on any workbooks/copies/text books are not acceptable in line with our golden rule to respect property
- No lines or margins to be drawn in copies without the use of a ruler
- All margins to be drawn in red pen only from 1<sup>st</sup> class
- A sample template will be distributed to parents and displayed in the classroom to ensure consistent expectations between school and home.
